## Historical Graveyard Tour

On a Saturday in October each year, the North Fork Community Theater, the Presbyterian Church, and the Mattituck Laurel Historical Society conduct a graveyard tour through the cemetery of the Presbyterian Church in Mattituck.

Burials began soon after the first church was built in 1715. The oldest stones in the cemetery are the children of Mary and Thomas Reeve, Ephram and Martha. They both died as infants in 1723.

Actors from the theater are authentically dressed as various people from the past and stand at their respective graves to tell visitors about their lives.

James Reeve (1672-1732), William Wells (1743-1825), Andrew Gildersleeve (1815-1894), and James and Frances Wickham and 4 others all give their stories.
