Clifford Wayne Tuthill was a life long resident of Long Island. He was born in Jamesport in a house right on Route 25. He went to Riverhead High School and held various jobs on the Island. C.W. Tuthill made history while working as a salesman for a Maxwell Automotive car dealership when he, along with a fellow salesman, P.G. Scull drove a new model Maxwell touring car from Newark, New Jersey to Los Angeles, California and back to prove it would make an excellent every day family car. They did the west bound trip in record time, 10 days and 16 hours.

Doug Tuthill Bassemir, C.W. Tuthill's grandson had an goal to recreate that same trip in the same model car, a Maxwell Touring Sedan, on the 100th anniversary. In 2008, Doug found a Maxwell for the trip and with the help of many, prepared the Maxwell for the cross country trip.

Doug, along with his brother, Richard Tuthill Bassemir, and friend John Brasca left Newark, New Jersey on November 16th, 2016. Exactly 100 years to the day, from the same spot C.W. Tuthill started. These three used Grandpa's diary to retrace his trip to Los Angeles.
